Jonathan will focus on how to improve your casting, with tips and advice on the elements essential to better casting whether it be for presentation, accuracy or distance. We will be bringing 30+ rods (first come first serve), but feel to bring your own so you can put into practice Jonathan's instruction on equipment you know. Additionally, please bring a hat and eye protection (sunglasses or eyeglasses). Jonathan has lived in Colorado for over 30 years, has over 20 years' experience teaching fly fishing, fly casting, and fly tying and is one of only a handful of FFI Master Certified Casting Instructors in the state. He created the Fly Fishing Section and Fly Fishing School of the Colorado Mountain Club. His teaching approach is based upon understanding your goals, assessing what is needed to achieve them, and breaking down the required skills into manageable steps. LADIES FISHING ON THE FLY – AUGUST 16 & 17, 2018, HIGHLANDS RANCH EASTRIDGE REC CENTER AND LAKE LEHOW



Join CCTU's Cyndy Scholz and her team of instructors for the 2019 edition of the very popular Ladies Fishing on the Fly. The Highlands Ranch Cultural Association teams up with the CCTU to teach ladies ages 16 and older the art of fly fishing. There is one classroom session, Friday, August 16 from 6-9pm, and an Outdoor Classroom and Field Trip Saturday, August 17, 8:30am-1pm. Expert Instructors lead this workshop that covers all of the basics of fly fishing: casting, reading the water, entomology, conservation, knots, landing and releasing...with plenty of hands-on practice. CCCTU BOARD MENTORS ALMA YOUTHS IN FLY FISHING



Cutthroat Chapter Board has supported the Alma Riverwalk for the last couple of seasons. This ambitious project by the Town of Alma was formed to permanently conserve and protect a stretch of the Middle Fork of the South Platte as it flows through the Town. The Alma Foundation has aided in the purchase of 24,000 acres of critical wetlands habitat by the City which will help protect this essential headwaters from encroachment by mining and housing development. The Riverwalk will provide ADA access and educational opportunities via a 1800 foot trail that is now under construction. When CCTU approached the Foundation about helping them this season we learned that the Foundation had plenty of young boots on the ground in the form of the Southwest Conservation Corps. The Corps is a non-profit based in Salida that provides conservation service programs for local youth. What the Foundation hoped was for us to spend the day with these youths and demonstrate to them some of the finer points of headwaters recreation. The Foundation was hoping we could give these high school age youth a lesson in fly fishing. We were happy to oblige! Four members of the CCTU Board and Alma resident David Andersen spent the morning of August 2 teaching a version of the Fly Fishing 101 and 201 classes taught by our partners at Orvis. Many thanks to Brian Young for providing his expertise leading the instruction and providing Orvis rods for the experience. After a casting lesson we moved to a local pond where the youth put their lessons into practice catching a few of the local trout. After fishing the Foundation provided a nice lunch for all, thanks to the South Platte Brewing of Fairplay. After lunch the youth were happy to take us on a hike to show all the tough trail work they had accomplished. We wish the Foundation all the best as the Riverwalk construction moves forward. They are optimistically hoping to compete construction by the end of next season, at which time there will be ADA accessible trails complete with interpretive signage funded by our Cutthroat Chapter. 

GRANT HOUX, ST. PETER'S FLY SHOP (FORT COLLINS), FLY FISHING THE POUDRE ... HOW TO CATCH A GRAND SLAM IN ONE DAY

Join Grant Houx, the owner of the two St. Peter's fly shops in Fort Collins, for a presentation on fishing the Cache De Poudre system. If you haven't fished the Poudre, you are missing out on a close-to-home fishery that has the size, numbers, and variety of fish to rival anywhere in the state. Grant has been fishing and guiding these waters for nearly two decades, and knows them better than anyone.

St. Peter's consists of two fly shops, the Remington Street location, and the South location on E Harmony. Both stores are in close proximity to a number of amazing waters including, the Poudre, Big Thompson, North Platte, and the waters of Rocky Mountain National Park. Grant spends his time both working in the shop full time and guiding on local water and the North Platte River. In the shop his roles are inventory management, guide coordinator and most importantly relationship building with our customers. As a guide Grant is an integral part of St. Peter's row team with over a decade of experience on the North Platte from North Gate to Casper. He has spent a significant amount of time traveling the world fly fishing from salt water destinations to Patagonia. In fly fishing, teaching is a driving facet of the sport for Grant. He is a Certified Casting Instructor who enjoys teaching people how to dial in their cast whether it is with a single or double handed rod.

BEAR CREEK ELECTROFISHING PROJECT – WEEK OF SEPT 9 (EXACT DATE TBD)



We wanted to make everyone aware that CCTU will again be assisting Colorado Parks and Wildlife (CPW) with an electroshocking project on Bear Creek. The project will be conducted the week of September 9. Once we have a specific day that week, we will pass that along. During the project, CCTU volunteers man nets and floating fish carts to store the fish that have been electroshocked. Volunteers must be in good physical shape, able to wade deep swift water and manage heavy loads. CPW personnel measure length and weight of each fish. The results of last year's project were surprising – 3 brown trout 18-19 inches, 12+ browns 14-18 inches, numerous Colorado native fish including longnose dace, white sucker, creek chubs, and longnose suckers.
