CTU/TU STREAM GIRLS PROGRAM

STREAM Girls is an outdoor watershed experience that employs STEM-education (science, technology, engineering, math) plus recreation and arts to explore a local stream. By visiting a local stream and having the opportunity to observe it as scientists, anglers, and artists, girls between the ages of 9-14 will get the complete picture of what their stream could mean to them. Over the course of multiple sessions, Girl Scouts (4 th – 8 th grade) observe a stream, collect flow data, sample macro-invertebrates (aka aquatic bugs), tie flies, and learn fly casting. Training and classes will start in March/April. No experience necessary to volunteer, but a strong interest in mentoring the next generation of scientists is encouraged. This month we highlight another great long-time partner for CCTU...The Blue Quill Angler in Evergreen. The Blue Quill has been a huge supporter of our Raffles and Silent Auctions – multiple guide trips from Pat Dorsey, guide trips from Joe Shafer, Kerry Caraghar, Jim Neiberger and

others. Pat and Joe have done several presentations over the past few years, all of which have been engaging and incredibly insightful. For the class students are provided a float tube, fins, and safety gear. Syndicate rods are also provided and loaded with floating, intermediate, and full sinking lines. Three classes are scheduled currently - May 15, May 29, and September 18. YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK VOLUNTEER FLY FISHING PROGRAM - 2020 PROGRAM



Paul Bunker from the West Denver chapter spoke about this program at a chapter meeting last year. If you are interested in being part of the 2020 program, you can get email updates from Paul, by contacting him at pnsbunker@comcast.net . He has provided the following status update on next year's program in a recent email... Funds for the program have been raised

and we have solid leads in procuring housing and transportation for the coordinator and volunteers. Although it still isn't time to make solid reservations, we are at a point where we need to recruit volunteers for the program so preliminary planning can start

for everyone. The program is anticipated to restart on or about Sunday, Jul 5, and possibly run through Saturday, August 29, 2020. Typically, volunteers check in with the program coordinator on Sunday evening to discuss the week's projects and depart on Saturday. However, volunteers who will be in the park for a day or two are welcome to join in the projects when space permits. We anticipate having a wall tent available for the volunteers to stay, along with cots, pads, small tables, etc. Volunteers staying in the tent will need to bring clean bedding (sleeping bag) and personal gear. Volunteers are always welcome to make their own reservations at their own expense at park lodging or nearby lodges/cabins outside the park.

ONE NATION WALKING TOGETHER FISHING EQUIPMENT **DONATION PROGRAM**



For the 4 th year, the West Denver Chapter will be collecting fishing equipment for Native American youths. They can use any spinning or casting equipment including rods, reels, hooks, lures, line, etc. (not fly fishing equipment). WDTU donates this equipment to a group called **One** Nation Walking Together . ONWT is

an organization that provides needed services to between 30,000 and 40,000 Native Americans in Colorado and 7 surrounding states. The equipment is used by these kids to supply food for their families on the reservations. WDTU goes through the donated equipment to make sure it is in working condition and then delivers it to ONWT at their Colorado Springs headquarters to be provided to different tribes. FLY OF THE MONTH – MATT'S MIDGE

Matt's Midge is arguably our favorite winter and spring midge dry pattern. Created by former Blue Quill guide Matt Miles, this killer down-wing midge pattern imitates an insect that's either recently hatched and waiting to fly or landed on the water to deposit eggs. Outside of size, this fly is easy to tie, with only three materials. A pattern every angler should have in their box in sizes 20-24. Video courtesy of Tim Flagler, Tightline Productions.



Thread Body - Black 6/0 Danville


Wings – White Zelon or Antron
