Program 1 - David Nickum, CTU Exec Director, Colorado TU in 30 minutes or Less

If you've wondered what Colorado Trout Unlimited is doing on behalf of you and other members around the state, here's your chance to get that picture in a nutshell. David will give a high-level overview of CTU's efforts in four mission

priority areas identified by the state board - promoting healthy rivers under Colorado's Water Plan, restoring strongholds for native trout, legislative advocacy for clean water and instream flow, and educating and engaging the next generation of young angler/conservationists.

David has worked with National and Colorado Trout Unlimited for a combined 25 years. Under his leadership, Colorado TU has successfully reformed state whirling disease policy, secured passage of legislation strengthening Colorado's in-stream flow program, and conducted many on-the-ground restoration projects for stream habitat and native trout recovery. A graduate of Duke University, he enjoys fishing in the Rocky Mountain National Park area on both sides of the Divide, as well as hiking and camping in Colorado's high country with his wife and two children.

Program 2 - Ty Churchwell TU, Good Samaritan Legislation & Animas Superfund Clean-up Update

Ty Churchwell will help us understand what has become a hot topic - Good Samaritan projects for the remediation of abandoned mining properties. He will talk their history and background, how abandoned mines impact water quality and fisheries, and the

legal quagmire with the Clean Water Act/CERCLA. He will also update us on the Animas Superfund Clean-up efforts and TU's path forward in both areas. Ty Churchwell is national TU's San Juan Mountains Coordinator and the Mining Coordinator for TU's "Sportsmen's Conservation Project (SCP) and based in Durango. Ty joined TU staff in 2008 after having been in chapter leadership with the Five Rivers chapter in Durango. He works primarily on state and federal mining policy while leading TU's involvement in the Superfund cleanup of mines in the Animas River watershed.

ONLINE PRESENTATION BY COLE BRITTAIN CSU STEVE BAILEY SCHOLARSHIP RECEIPIENT



Cole Brittain is the 2019/20 recipient of the CCTU Steve Bailey Memorial Scholarship at CSU. He is a Master's candidate in the Fish, Wildlife, and Conservation Biology graduate program at CSU with a focus on research in fish passage. He was supposed to present at our cancelled April meeting, and was nice enough to add audio to his presentation so we could load it onto the CCTU

YouTube site. His presentation is on the effects of Substrates on Rock Ramp Fish Passage Structures . Fish passage structures, such as rock ramp style fishways, can be used to circumvent dams and other structures that prevent upstream movement of fish. His project tests the passage probabilities of three native small-bodied fish species that differ in swimming performance (Arkansas Darter, Flathead Chub, Stonecat) to develop criteria crucial for passage success in rock ramp fishways. Cole's project is definitely consistent with the CCTU mission and highly interesting. Give it a watch.

FLY OF THE MONTH - SKINNY NELSON




Tracey Peterson developed this pattern as a combination Baetis Nymph/Midge Larva on the Bighorn River in Montana. It is a simple but deadly fly. It works great in any stream or river with small mayfly nymphs, and is highly effective throughout Colorado waters. It can be tied with or without a tungsten bead.

Usually tied in sizes 18-20 but can be effective in slightly smaller or larger sizes as well. This was one of the patterns Eddy Wittry tied at the April CCTU Virtual Meeting during his Bighorn River presentation. Video courtesy of Eddy Wittry.
