




Silent Auction – We will be auctioning off a few prizes, including a framed Dave Whitlock print at the event

# ALASKA FISHING TRIP Scott Tampa & Meg Renton

In September, Scott (CCTU President) and Meg (CCTU Treasurer) joined Blue Quill Angler's Pat Dorsey and wife Kim on a trip to the Alaska Sportsman's Lodge, located on the Kvichak (kwee-jack) River. The lodge provides first-class accommodations, culinary experiences and some of the best fishing in Alaska. The Bristol Bay watershed, home to the world's richest commercial and sport salmon fisheries, is Alaska's only designated "Trophy Rainbow Trout" area, and the largest red salmon run in the world. The purity of this nutrient rich environment allows fish to grow to enormous size.

Their trip included up to 6 fly-outs and a day of fishing on the Kvichak. The weather mostly







cooperated with only a couple days of mild rain brought on by the remnants of Typhoon Merbok as it headed towards Nome. Fishing excursions started every morning following a made-toorder breakfast. We took 1957 vintage DeHavilland Beaver float planes to river destinations (Moraine Creek, Gibraltar, etc) where rafts were assembled for day long floats filled with sockeye catching grizzlies, fishing and a hot lunch. We also flew to the coast to catch our limit of silver salmon from the Swikshak, which the lodge staff fileted, vacuum sealed, froze and packaged for our trip home. On the Kvichak and Naknek, we boarded jet boats and did drifts in search of gigantic rainbows. The Naknek did not disappoint and provided the highlight of our week: Scott landed a 30 inch "Trophy" Rainbow Trout, just beating Meg's 29.5 inch Rainbow landed 15 minutes prior. It was the trip of a lifetime which made for lasting memories and new friendships. We highly recommend a trip to the Alaska Sportsman's Lodge for any serious fly fisher in search of challenging monster rainbows. immersion in natural beauty, and the best staff and guides Alaska has to offer.

# UCCS STUDENT HAYDEN STRAIT SURVEY REQUEST

Below is a letter we received from a student at UC- Colorado Springs. If you have a couple of minutes, please participate in the survey.

Greetings Cutthroat Chapter of Trout Unlimited,

My name is Hayden Strait and I am a student researcher at the University of Colorado-Colorado Springs (UCCS) working on a project that focuses on conservation genetics and management of wild and native trout. This past summer, I was able to meet with the local Pikes Peak Chapter of Trout Unlimited to ask members about their views on the management and value of wild, native, and genetically pure trout. I'm writing today to see if you might be willing to share a brief survey with members of your Trout Unlimited chapter so we can begin to assess angler perspectives more broadly across the region.

This research is part of a National Science Foundation-supported project examining how increasing scientific understanding of fish genetics intersects with angler preferences and agency management policies. I've included a link
