

RECAP: November Chapter Meeting

The Chapter held its November meeting on Tuesday the 21st at the Lone Tree Brewery. This month's speaker was Tyler Banks from Minturn Anglers discussing fly fishing the Flat Tops Wilderness Area. Minturn partners with an outfitter to bring clients into the Flat Tops on horseback for day and overnight adventures. Riding can be as short as an hour or as long and three or more depending on how far back into the area clients want to go. Of course, the longer the ride the less chance of seeing other anglers.

This is small stream and lake fishing for Cutthroat and other trout species in water that sees lead pressure that most places in Colorado. While the clients are fishing, the outfitter takes care of setting up camp and meals. Our members asked a lot of questions specific to the fishing the region and riding in on horseback. For those that want to pursue this adventure, Tyler offered a 10% discount.

The monthly raffle awarded some lucky members a new pack, CCTU Tumblers and fly boxes.

The Grizzly Mine is located in the Southern Rocky Mountains on the Arapaho and Roosevelt National Forests, six miles southwest of Silver Plume in Clear Creek County, Colorado, at 10,800 feet. The project site resides within what was historically known as the Argentine Mining District and is adjacent to Grizzly Gulch in the Headwaters of Clear Creek. The mine operated from the early 1870s to the late 1950s, with the primary mineral production output consisting of silver, lead, and zinc.

Today, there are some 500,000 abandoned mines across the western U.S. Many of these AML sites chronically leak heavy metals and other toxic substances into streams and groundwater, degrading the environment and popular trout streams. In the western U.S., roughly 140,000 AML sites have been identified as posing physical or environmental hazards. TU is committed to protecting trout streams from adverse impacts associated with abandoned mines and has made giant strides to date in restoring impaired streams – one mine at a time.




