

CCTU 2019 FUNDRAISING PROGRAM – ONLY ON SALE FOR ANOTHER MONTH...TICKETS STILL AVAILABLE!



We are winding down the 2019 CCTU's annual Fundraising efforts with the end of the Raffle program on August 20th. We aren't having the Fundraising Party this year (with Fly Auctions, Silent Auctions), so the Raffle program is your main opportunity to support chapter projects and have an excellent chance to win a prize from our greatest list of donated items yet.

We have 40 prizes this year, making it our biggest raffle ever. These donated items range from 17 different guided float, fishing trips and lessons, 5 great equipment packages including a Scott Tampa bamboo rod, 9 fly box prizes filled with over 50 dozen flies, 7 framed prints or photography, and 2 restaurant or wine oriented prizes. GARY OKIZAKI, EURONYMPHING TECHNIQUES & SECRETS FOR SUCCESS



Join Colorado native and long-time Colorado Guide (currently with the Blue Quill and 5280 Angler) Gary Okizaki for a fascinating presentation on his techniques and secrets for successful Euronymphing. This presentation will be informative and intriguing for both experienced tightline nymphers, as well as those just starting out with this form of fly fishing. Gary will cover a wide range of tightline topics including leader design, fishing techniques by water type, rods and other equipment, and more.

Gary Okizaki has been a guide for over 20 years and brings a wealth of experience and tall tails to his clients. He is an accomplished nymph and streamer fly fisher, but has placed a key focus on Euronymphing and other tightline techniques for the last decade. He has been fishing since the age of six and has fished and learned from some of the best fly fishers in the U.S. His passion for Euronymphing started years ago during a trip with Jay Buchner, the 2004 captain of the U.S. Fly Fishing team and his skills and expertise has been honed over the last decade. He is also a highly innovative commercial fly tyer and ties at shows all over the West.

Fly Tying - Gary will tie his favorite tactical nymphs from 6:30 to 7pm.

Casting with Buzz - From 6 to 6:30, meet Buzz Soard on the lawn on the north side of the school entrance for casting practice and coaching. Bring your own rod, but Buzz will have hoop targets and other casting assistance equipment.

We are lucky to have Master Certified Casting Instructor Jonathan Walter from Clear Creek Fly Casting to do a group casting event for us starting at 5pm. Jonathan will focus on how to improve your casting, with tips and advice on the elements essential to better casting whether it be for presentation, accuracy or distance. We will be bringing 30+ rods (first come first serve), but feel to bring your own so you can put into practice Jonathan's instruction on equipment you know. Additionally, please bring a hat and eye protection (sunglasses or eyeglasses). Jonathan has lived in Colorado for over 30 years, has over 20 years' experience teaching fly fishing, fly casting, and fly tying and is one of only a handful of FFI Master Certified Casting Instructors in the state. He created the Fly Fishing Section and Fly Fishing School of

the Colorado Mountain Club. His teaching approach is based upon understanding your goals, assessing what is needed to achieve them, and breaking down the required skills into manageable steps.
