J oin us for a fun and informative presentation by Ron Belak entitled "Fly Fishing the Backcountry of Argentina, Alaska and Colorado without Busting Your Butt." The show will focus on places to go and how to fish without having to expend the physical exertion often associated with forays into the backcountry. The backcountry allows anglers to get away from the crowds while enjoying spectacular scenery and catching some large trout. The alternative to long hikes, of course, is horses, drift boats and airplanes. Ron will walk, or perhaps motorize, us through locations to fish in the Flat Tops of Colorado, the Patagonia region of Argentina and the Kenai Peninsula and Lake Iliamna areas of Alaska.

Ron Belak is an award-winning writer and photographer from Evergreen, Colorado. His new book, "Fly Fishing Colorado's Backcountry, consists of over 40 how-to articles he published in Colorado Outdoors magazine from 1994 to 2018. He has fished the Colorado backcountry for 40 years, hitting about 400 different Colorado high lakes and reservoirs, as well as others in Wyoming, Idaho, Oregon, Alaska, British Columbia and Argentina. Educated as a scientist with degrees in geology and significant coursework in the biological sciences, he approaches fly fishing from an analytical perspective, trying to decide what strategies, techniques, equipment and patterns work and what is the scientific basis for why they work. Ron's writing has appeared in Colorado Outdoors, Fly Fisherman, and American Angler magazines.

CTU/TU STREAM GIRLS PROGRAM

STREAM Girls is an outdoor watershed experience that employs STEM-education (science, technology, engineering, math) plus recreation and arts to explore a local stream. By visiting a local stream and having the opportunity to observe it as scientists, anglers, and artists, girls between the ages of 9-14 will get the complete picture of what their stream could mean to them. Over the course of multiple sessions, Girl Scouts (4 th – 8 th grade) observe a stream, collect flow data, sample macro-invertebrates (aka aquatic bugs), tie flies, and learn fly casting. Training and classes will start in March/April. No experience necessary to volunteer, but a strong interest in mentoring the next generation of scientists is encouraged. CTU RIVER CONSERVATION & FLY FISHING YOUTH CAMP



This fantastic camp is designed to educate 14 to 18 year old students on the importance of cold-water conservation and provide hands-on fly fishing instruction. Approximately 20 students are selected each year, based on their qualifications and a written essay on why they would like to attend the camp. The camp will run June 7-13 at Silent Springs Resort near Gunnison,

CO. **Student applications are due April 1, 2020**. The Youth Camp team could use your help in two ways. **First, they need camper** s. Too often they do not reach the capacity of the camp, which is a shame given the type of education offered and the amount of work involved in putting the camp together. **Secondly, consider a donation of money, fly tying materials, extra fly fishing equipment, etc. to the CTU Youth Education Programs**. 


CCTU PARTNER FOCUS - THE COALITION FOR THE UPPER SOUTH PLATTE (CUSP)

T his month we highlight another great long-time partner for CCTU conservation...The Coalition for the Upper South Platte (CUSP). CUSP has partnered with CCTU for South Platte drainage conservation projects for a number of years, thanks to some great coordinational efforts by George Franklin and others. Since 1998, CUSP has worked to protect the 1.6 million-acre watershed that reaches from the Continental Divide to Strontia Springs Reservoir, southwest of Denver. The watershed is a recreational mecca with over 1 million acres of public lands; it provides municipal water for about three guarters of Colorado's residents; it is renowned for its "gold-medal" fishing streams; and it is home to numerous threatened and endangered species. CUSP works with partners to provide essential services



such as project planning, implementation, and monitoring within the watershed. CUSP crews work tirelessly, whether on-the-ground or in the boardroom, to ensure communication, cooperation and completion of vital programs. Working with volunteers, we plant thousands of trees each year, restore habitat, and improve recreational opportunities. Our crews also remove damaged and diseased trees, and help reduce wildfire threats in our communities.

CCTU will continue to fund and help staff volunteer projects in conjunction with CUSP going forward. One of our most recent projects is the Deckers River Access Stairs project. In 2019, to help address South Platte erosion and sedimentation issues from social trails at the intersection of the South Platte River and Highway 126 in Deckers, CUSP partnered with CCTU to complete four sets of large, stone stairs. Three sets of stairs have been completed and work on the fourth set began in the Fall of 2019. Once the stairs are completed, the team will seed and install jute matting. 
FLY OF THE MONTH – RIM CHUNG'S RSII

If you haven't had the pleasure of meeting Rim, he is truly one of the gentleman of our sport and industry. The RSII is tied numerous different ways, but we thought it might be nice to see how the pattern's originator ties it...a little bit differently than other folks. Rim ties it in many different body colors, but with the Dark Dun saddle hackle web for nearly all the wings. Interestingly, he designed this fly originally to be fished primarily on the swing...give it a try next time you are out. **Hook** – TMC 101 Size 18-26...but can go larger **Thread** – Grey 8/0 Uni-thread **Body** – Natural Beaver Fur Grey **Wings** – Dark Dun Color Saddle Hackle...use the web **Tail** – Dark Dun Micro Fibetts


