PROGRAM 1 - DAVID NICKUM, CTU EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, THE STATE OF CTU & COLORADO PRIORITY WATERS INITIATIVE

We are lucky to have David Nickum with us for the April meeting. If you've wondered what Colorado Trout Unlimited is doing on behalf of you and other members around the state, here's your chance to get that picture in a nutshell. David will give a high-level overview of CTU's efforts across the state, including a detailed perspective on the Colorado Priority Waters Initiative.

More broadly, she is a hydrologist and fish ecologist with expertise in water quality, fire science, urban stream ecology and restoration, and lake water quality and ecology.

CTU CONSERVATION & FLY FISHING YOUTH CAMP

JUNE 12-18, AEI BASE CAMP, TAYLOR PARK, CO NOMINATE A CCTU SCHOLARSHIP CANDIDATE TODAY!

Colorado Trout Unlimited will host the 17th annual River Conservation and Fly Fishing Camp for teen youth at AEI Base Camp in Taylor Park, Colorado, June 12-18, 2022. Since 2006, youth from across the state and beyond have gathered to complete a week-long program of STEM-based conservation education and instruction in the art of fly fishing. Youth 14-18 are eligible to apply for camp, chapters statewide provide scholarships to campers in need. In parallel with Orvis, we are working to achieve 50/50 gender diversity at camp. This camp provides a unique immersive experience for teens interested in the outdoors, fly fishing, and potential conservation-related career paths. Campers participate in hands-on conservation activities and receive one-on-one and group instruction in the art of fly fishing. Their experience is enriched as they make lifelong relationships, "finding their people" and bonding with peers of similar interests. The program exposes campers to the complexity of water management in the west and its nexus with recreation. The diversity of the conservation program is designed so that participants can envision multiple education and career paths that align with their personal passion for the outdoors.

DON'T FORGET TO RENEW YOUR FISHING LICENSE NEW YEAR STARTS APRIL 1!



Colorado Fishing Licenses and State Park Passes all expire on March 31st. The 2022 license runs from 3/1/22 to 3/31/23...so can buy it now if you don't want to forget. Cost is \$47.30 (for non-senior residents, including req'd habitat stamp) and the easiest way to renew your fishing license is online https://www.cpwshop.com/licensing.page or by phone (800) 244-5613.

State Park Passes run the same timing, are \$80 per vehicle and can be renewed at

RENEWABLE WATER RESOURCES' DOUGLAS COUNTY WATER EXPORT PROPOSAL



Many of you may be aware that the Douglas County Commissioners are considering different options for satisfying the county's long-term water needs. One such plan is that from Renewable Water Resources, a plan to export up to 22,000 acre-feet of water

per year from a series of groundwater wells in the northern part of the San Luis Valley. Water conservation districts, farming advocacy groups and environmental advocates from the valley have said the proposal would have a profound negative impact on the valley community, both physically and economically. Representatives from RWR have said the project wouldn't cause any harm to the valley and have offered a \$50 million community fund as part of their plan. Trout Unlimited, Colorado Trout Unlimited, and a number of state TU chapters (including CCTU) have expressed their disagreement with this trans-basin diversion.

FLY OF THE MONTH - PAT DORSEY'S MEDALLION MIDGE



Given Pat Dorsey is presenting this month, figured it couldn't hurt to include another of his famous patterns. Pat designed this pupa pattern for the technical trout of the South Platte, and it should have a place in any winter/early spring trout angler's box. We don't go anywhere this time of year without it in a Size 20 and 22. The pattern's name comes from the Medallion Sheeting, which gives a realistic thorax with brilliant luster and back swept wing buds. An incredibly realistic midge pupa pattern. Fish it dead drifted or in the film. The key is to make sure you are fishing it in the trout's feeding zone at that time. Video courtesy of Umpqua Feather Merchants.

Hook – TMC 101 #20-24

Thread/Body – UNI 8/0 Dark Brown


Ribbing – UNI 6/0 White

Thorax – Superfine Dubbing Rust Brown

Wing Buds/Case – Medallion Sheeting...Buggy Dark Dun or Swiss Straw or Dark Dun

NEW READS & RE-READS A TROUT UNLIMITED BOOK, THE GIFT OF TROUT


