Conservation Projects (John E)

- South Platte River Corridor/Cheesman Canyon
 - CUSP Signage \$1250 to be paid in FY25-FY24. The signs will likely be complete and ready to install this year. They would like us to help with the removal/replacement of the signs.
 - Gill Trail Restoration Project:
 - Implementation of the Pilot Project will be the focus in 2024. Cost estimate for this Pilot Project has been developed by the ERO/Tapis/RMFI teams. CCTU will submit Grant proposals to secure these funds. The USFS has stated that they will fund and conduct the NEPA study which is required before work on the ground can start.
 - David Nickum will look into additional organizations that could help sponsor this project. He will also bring it up with the other TU orgs since this section of river is a high priority.
 - South Platte Cleanup: Order food (to do), county coordination (in work), prize sponsorship (complete), room reservation (in work), raffle license (to do)
- Earth Day Tree Planting: The City of Lakewood has confirmed the donation amount of \$3000 (same as last year). These funds will be provided at the beginning of the fiscal year (April 1). John will provide the address to Meg to mail the check to.
 - Anglers All has their clave event on April 20th as well = there may be some way to collaborate with them on your Earth Day volunteer project as well - Mike has reached out

Financials (Meg)

- Current financials through Feb 28, 2023, = \$47,102 (See Treasurer's report [\$13.3K is a restricted grant fund]); down \$9,000 from last month. So available non-restricted funds are \$33,731.

Fundraising (Mark Davis)

- 2024 Fundraising
 - The 2024 Fundraising Raffle will be led by Mark Davis.
 - CCTU will use the platform from CTU for on-line sales. All prize pictures, value and description will be provided to CTU and they will load them to the raffle site.
 - CCTU will secure approval from the Colorado Secretary of State for running the Raffle under their license.
 - No CCTU funds will be spent to secure new prizes, although some funds will be necessary to frame the artwork that will be included in the Raffle
 - Ticket prices will be \$50 each. No limitation on how many tickets will be sold. Goal is to sell a minimum of 160 tickets.
 - The winning tickets will be selected by a random number generator during the November membership meeting.
- Meg will look into the option where members can donate through Safeway. Scott looked into this and provided information to the BOD. Consensus was not to pursue Safeway since it required a purchase of cards by the Chapter and then selling them to the members.
- We will hold a silent auction at the Chapter picnic in August from "garage sale" items donated by the Chapter membership.
