### Conservation Programs/other events: George

- Alma Foundation: George
  - o Applying for Colorado Outdoors and CPW Trail grant to build trails and boardwalks. Planning to be done in the spring 2020. They have received a \$250,000 grant from Park County
  - o Will want to budget a donation for 2020. To discuss at Annual Planning meeting. Deadline is 1/1/20
  - CTU contacted Allen offering grant monies via "Can'd AID", up to \$8K. George to pursue with Jara.
- Bristol Bay: Jim K raised the issue of helping to fund TU's lawsuit against the EPA's recent approval of the Pebble Mine project in Alaska. Allen discussed this with TU prez Chris Wood, but got a different point of view than did Cam. Will pursue at Planning Meeting. Allen will talk with Nickum.
- South Platte Stream Management plan: Allen and other TU Denver Metro Chapter presidents were contacted by Nickum regarding an ambitious project:

**o** Gents

as presidents of the three chapters with greatest interest and history of involvement in portions of the South Platte, I wanted to gage your interest in participating in a Stream Management Plan e ffort – or something akin to it – to identify priority projects on the North Fork and mainstem (likely only below Cheesman, not ab ove for the mainstem)? Denver Water, as part of its Moffat Project mitigation, will be providing \$ 1.5 Million toward restoration work on the North Fork, and CPW has suggested that some of thos e funds might be shifted to the mainstem. Developing design concepts and identifying priorities f or those funds (and seeking to leverage the funds further through grants and partnerships) seems like а good next step but one that will require engaging the counties, Forest Service, CPW, and other stakeholders alo ng with Denver Water. I don't think we can put anything together to seek SMP grants to help this process for the current cycle (with a beginning of November deadline to apply), but we could sta rt to engage the key parties and develop a consensus approach for the planning effort and pursue final design funds from CWCB in November 2020 ... Any initial reactions on this? IF your chapte r might have interest, who would be the "point person" who could participate with us on the effort in the coming months?

- Nickum was unclear about the scope of this project, but will get back once he hears from CPW. George to talk with CSUP
- "Conservation Volunteer" T-shirts. Discussed offering these as a complementary prize. 100 for \$1,000. Jim Klug to pursue. Will discuss at planning meeting
- Bear Creek Earth Day Project: Negotiations completed, proposal will be shared prior to planning meeting for consideration.
- Gill Trail Bridge Sign: Peter. Sign completed installed 10/17: USFS and CCTU (George, Jerry, Peter, John A)
- Forest Service: adopt a stream Jim R: Being pulled together now by USFS: pending
- River Watch Jim R
  - Blue Tooth temperature loggers Jim R
    - o \$400 budgeted  $\rightarrow$  pending to FY 2020 working on it
    - Current contractor withdrew after 1 year; a new non-profit has stepped forward, and the project is up and running. Two monitors floated downstream, never to be found; Jim will replace.
  - Pine Creek Culvert: Allen. Communications with Nickum.

Allen contacted Nickum indicating that funds have already been budgeted for FY 2019. Nickum was going t o provide further information; thus far, no word.
