#### **President's Report**

- BOD Roles and Responsibilities were updated and provided in the March BOD meeting minutes. Changes/Updates? Todd Johnson has decided that he needs to step down as Treasurer. His duties will be transferred to Aaron Gardner (Co-Treasurer to Treasurer)
- Financial Quarterly Reporting Stephanie Young is preparing report. Consulting costs will be billed at \$25/hour. This effort will be added to the 2021/2022 budget. Brian Young is documenting all of the required steps/documents that need to be performed in order to file with the State of Colorado and the Colorado Trout Unlimited. Quarterly report should be reviewed with Aaron Gardner (Treasurer) to assure understanding of reporting requirements and performing this task in the future.
- Finalize volunteer hours NO LATER THAN April 15 and send to Brian Young. These hours are for 2020/2021 efforts
- Leo Gomolchak Conservation Grant CTU invited Chapters to apply for a grant designated for projects that would benefit conservation efforts and organizational development at the chapter level (\$1500.00 max). CCTU submitted a grant application for \$750 for the South Platte River Cleanup project.

• Earth Day Bear Creek Lake Park Project – George The City of Lakewood reports that they will be performing a "modified" Earth Day project this year, to be held on Saturday, April 24 from 8:00am-Noon. CCTU volunteers will be assigned to work on planting in the Bear Creek Greenbelt. No breakfast this year, but there will be a "grab and go" lunch provided. Special Covid safety protocols will be implemented to assure everyone's safety. Particulars will be worked out with the City of Lakewood. CCTU may bring up to 20 volunteers. Once the particulars are worked out with the City of Lakewood, George will provide Brian the details and the request for volunteers will go out to the Chapter via Social Media and the Chapter Newsletter.

our donation. The Board discussed and voted to release the funds. Ray will coordinate this with CTU (Geoff Elliot)

- \$1800 for Sharon Lance Youth Programs (according to Nickum Partnership Project Investments 2021 email, this is in support of the annual Colorado TU youth camp) – The nature and source of this fund was clarified as follows:
  - This is a restricted CCTU Fund named in honor of Sharon Lance designated for youth fishing camp scholarships
  - The fund has, in recent years, been generously funded by Orvis
  - <u>Use of the fund will depend on whether fishing camp is held this year</u>

A check of the CTU Youth Programs website states that the "2021 River Conservation and Fly-Fishing Camp <u>WILL NOT</u> be accepting new camper applications. Applications for 2022 will be available in January 2022".

- CSU Scholarship \$4200 approved
- Camp Shady Brook Chris Maddy (Associate Executive Director) of the YMCA residential camp and retreat located in Deckers, Colorado implements programs for children of fallen service members, children with life threatening diagnosis, and those who visiting the mountains would be only a dream without the help of others. This year with the support of Angler's Covey (David Leinweber (owner) and Jon Easdon (head guide)) they have a goal of introducing 200+ youth to fly fishing. They are seeking the financial support of CCTU to purchase flies (10/child) in addition to the appropriate leaders and terminal tackle at the discounted price of \$4000.00. Angler's Covey is providing rods and reels plus instruction. If acceptable, they would be willing to present to the CCTU BOD. The BOD discussed this request, and all agreed that it sounded as a worthy endeavor but questioned the amount of funds needed. Scott Tampa agreed to contact Angler's Covey to discuss what they thought the right level would need to be. Aaron Gardner wanted to know if any CCTU personnel would be needed to help with this effort during the year. Scott agreed to reach out to Chris Maddy to see if they had any personnel needs.
  - Update post BOD meeting Scott spoke with David Leinweber (Angler's Covey) and Chris Maddy (Camp Shady Brook) and received the following update: Angler's Covey will be providing Orvis Clearwater Rod/Reel outfits (\$376) at a discounted (60% off) rate and will be providing instruction when needed. CCTU is being asked to donate funds that would cover the portion of cost not covered in the Angler's Covey discount (\$150/outfit plus tax = \$162/outfit). Fifteen (15) outfits would equate to a \$2500.00 donation. This request will be brought before the BOD in May.
  - Chris Maddy stated that he would gladly accept any CCTU volunteers to help with instruction. Chris also reached out to CTU Geoff Elliott who provided him the instruction material that CTU developed for Youth Education.

#### **Other Chapter Business**

- Operating volunteer events in the present Covid environment ideas As a bare minimum, the events must follow the guidelines of the County that the event is occurring at. As a Chapter, we suggested that masks should be worn any time that a 6 foot social distance could not be maintained. When outdoors, if a distance greater than 6 feet can be maintained, then the participants may remove their face coverings as long as it is not in violation of the County guidelines. A new Covid waiver form (attached) has been created by TU Inc. Each gathering needs to have this form signed by the participants of the event.
- Local Fishing Trips update David (on vacation in Florida from 2 March for 6 weeks Returning for April 23<sup>rd</sup> Lake Lehow event). Ron Taniwaki asked if there were funds in the budget to host BBQ events at Lake Lehow. The Board asked Ron to work with David to see how many BBQ's they would propose to do and to make sure that it did not distract from the main object of the outings (teaching people how to fly fish). They are to bring their proposal back to the Board for approval.
  - See February 6<sup>th</sup> email for requested Lake Lehow dates plus other outing locations
- Holiday Party Date? Is venue selected and locked in? Status? John Aaron John stated that he has not done anything with this yet and that he will contact Allen in order for them to arrange a time to discuss
- August Picnic Is venue locked in? Status? John Aaron Peter King stated that he has agreed to work the permitting for Reynold's Landing site. We are still looking for someone to take on the overall leadership of this project including the activity normally scheduled during the event and the food/beverage that will be available
- BOD Retreat
  - Ouray Ranch booked for August 20-22 Brian Young secured this reservation with funds out of his own pocket. These funds (\$600) have been reimbursed from the CCTU account
  - Did East Troublesome fire impact any of the usual fishing beats? Brian/Jim K
  - Send Scott Tampa names/qty of individuals attending and if staying at lodge (8 rooms available/12 beds) or elsewhere
  - Deposits (\$100) will be required for those staying at lodge. Individuals reserving their spots (with deposit paid) get priorities on fishing beats, so do not delay. (Four deposits have been made).
