## **President's Report**

- Ray attended the CTU Rendezvous (Oct 21-23) in Glenwood Springs representing the CCTU Chapter. Outbrief by Ray
  - A second reviewer of the Chapter's financial records needs to be performed by the Financial Reviewer
    - John Egan will be the Chapter's Financial Reviewer and will report out each month at the BOD so the results of his review can be documented in the BOD meeting minutes
  - Federal money is available (infrastructure); USFS does not want to create contracts because of
    government red tape, so they would look for outside organizations to lead this effort. Work should
    be targeted against infrastructure type of effort
- Holiday Party Need someone to MC the event (Scott and Meg out of town)
  - o Barry volunteered to MC the event
  - o Ron Taniwaki asked if we could investigate moving the activity to the Lone Tree Brewing Co. (LTBC) as it might bring in additional participants over the school cafeteria venue
    - Ron contacted LTBC and found out that Dec 13 is not available as it was already scheduled for an event. For future reference, LTBC stated that food for the Pot Luck could be brought in for the event.
- CCTU BOARD OF DIRECTORS
  - CCTU BOD make-up
    - Vote on Vice President position (starting in January)
      - Scott nominated John Egan to assume the role of Chapter Vice President starting in January
         2023. John would continue his role as Conservation Director
      - A unanimous vote of acceptance by the board was provided
    - After announcing that he would like to move to Emeritus status, Allen changed his position and stated that he will stay on as Secretary of the Chapter until a replacement can be found. Allen also stated that he will continue to lead the Steve Bailey Memorial Scholarship activities, but that he will not be able to lead the yearly raffle event
      - Chapter will need to find new Secretary (Leadership Position)
      - Need to find volunteer to lead Raffle Activity

 Current BOD make-up - 10 Board Members, 9 Emeritus Board Members (Matt Moskal and John Aaron removed from the list), majority 6 required for quorum

## Membership Meetings -

    - o the venue at Cresthill Middle School; reservation has already been made
    - Activities: potluck, white elephant, silent auction (maybe). We have 2 framed Whitlock prints to potentially auction. It was also suggested that we set up a donation bucket
  - January Pat Dorsey stated that he would love to be the first speaker out our new membership meeting venue. Subject for now is TBD.
    - Scott, Barry and Ron will visit the Lone Tree Brewing Co. to verify the AV equipment that Ron has
      is sufficient to provide viewing/hearing capabilities in the room
- Speaker selection committee needs new members. All Board members should send Scott their suggestions for next year's speakers/topics.
  - O John suggested conducting a Fly Fishing 101 course with Orvis. Discussion noted that this course is provided in the Orvis store and that they provide free membership to the CCTU Chapter for all participants and that each participant receives valuable discounts in the store for attending and that CCTU should not compete with the store for those clients. Instead, the Chapter should piggy-back on that class and offer speakers that could take the student to the next level ("Bugs 101 by Peter Stitcher, Casting instruction (weather permitting) by Jonathan Walters, fly tying instruction by the Chapter members, culminating in a outing (Lake Lehow?) ).
  - Following speaker presentations on locations to fish, an outing to that location could then be organized by the Chapter
  - Meg stated that the Fly Fishing show is scheduled for February 17-19. We should review the list of shops/presenters to see if there is interest from that group to present at our Chapter meetings
  - Other topics to cover during our Chapter Membership meetings discussed are:
    - Trout in the Classroom (TIC) Hold event when trout are being released into streams
      - Investigate having CTU add cameras/live streaming of the fish as they grow from eggs to fry
        - o It was noted that cameras are already installed in the classroom
      - Cory will reach out to John Davenport (CTU?) to make a presentation to the Chapter about the TIC program and have one of the area's school teachers present the affects the program has on the students
    - Gill Trail restoration Have trail design team come and present their findings/recommendations to the Chapter
    - Suggestion was made to reach out to Pat Dorsey to see if he has recommendations on speakers. Scott will reach out to Pat to see if he has any suggestions
    - The Cottonwood camp on the Big Horn has changed ownership last year. Scott will reach out to the new owner (Aaron Mumford) to see if he would like to make a presentation
    - We should have a lodge or outfitter on the Green River come and present before the yearly outing. Scott will contact Rich Hus for recommendations
    - Invite to Hayden Strait (student at UC-Colorado Springs) to speak about his research

# **Conservation Programs**

- South Platte River Corridor/Cheesman Canyon John E
  - CUSP Signage \$1250 to be paid in FY23. A total of 10 signs will be produced, currently in the design process via CUSP. For simplicity, all the signs will be identical, thus CCTU's name and logo will appear on all ten signs.
     To be installed in TBD. Artwork is under development, CUSP has CCTU artwork for incorporation on the

signs. CUSP and Denver Water have apparently reconciled their differences.; CCTU will make its contribution towards the signs once they are installed. The \$150 of restricted funds will be used for this effort

- Lower Gill Trail: USFS has acknowledged that the Gill Trail needs restoration work performed to lessen the amount of erosion happening due to natural events and greater usage. Denver Water has agreed to partner with the USFS for their portion of the trail improvements. CCTU will be in the loop as this project develops. CCTU has submitted this stretch of river as our "Priority Waters" to CTU This remains a continuing effort.
  - This is moving forward. Contract has been executed between Denver Water and the professional trail design firms (Tapis Assoc Inc & ERO Resources Corp) to map and assess the existing Gill Trail conditions, and to provide recommendations for trail design improvements. Effort should start sometime between September and October
  - Grant funds awarded to CCTU from the SPEB have been received. These funds will be provided to Denver Water who is executing the contract with the trail design firms
- Wigwam Creek Bridge Repair: The USFS "Collection Agreement" between the Forestry Service and CCTU has been executed. All parties have signed the document and the funds to repair the bridge have been provided to the USFS. Once the foundations have been replaced/repaired the bridge will be placed back. The USFS has selected a contractor to perform the work and the contract has been signed. The bridge/trail repair work was completed as of 10/25/2022. Pictures provided by the USFS show a great improvement to the bridge foundation and creek bank around the bridge
- TU Orphan Boy Mine Project Design fees for the Mine restoration project \$5,500.00 were provided John E visited the site in June. John E met with Lauren Dunken at TU to organize. This project needs more money and plans. John E will assume leadership; most likely any further work will rely on contractors, not volunteers.

#### **FUNDRAISING**

• Board discussed moving the annual fundraising winner announcement back to the August picnic event in order to save on costs of renting a facility (Breckenridge Brewery) and to increase participation in the annual picnic. A vote was taken, and the board unanimously approved the resolution. Prizes that are associated with an activity need to show which year they will take place (ie – guided fishing trip will take place in year 202X).

- Chapter Webpage Mike Myers said that he would continue to update the webpage as needed. All updates

- ➤ Trout in the Classroom: Cory will lead this effort. The Board accepted his willingness to take this on. Cory recently attended a session at a Littleton school who is interested in funding from CCTU. Ray stated that CTU retains ownership of the tanks and equipment that the schools currently have. Cory will also be in contact with schools to consider presentation by CCTU Board members, e.g. etymology, fly tying, development of eggs, etc.
- CSU Scholarship Allen has made contact with the scholarship recipient .(Nitsa Platis)
  - Her Master's work is studing the norther section of the Blue River
  - A presentation tentatively set for May 2023
- Allen will continue to lead this activity in 2023

- August Picnic We will combine this event with the annual raffle winner's announcement to promote a larger turnout
